USED TO WITH REQUENCY ADVERBS

With the <u>present simple</u>, we often use adverbs of frequency to say 'how often' we do something. Here's a list of common adverbs:

- Always
- Frequently
- Generally
- Hardly ever
- Infrequently
- Never
- Normally
- Occasionally
- Often
- Rarely
- Regularly
- Seldom
- Sometimes
- Usually

We usually put these adverbs in the middle of the sentence, between the subject and the verb:

- I often go to the cinema.
- She sometimes visits me at home.
- · We usually drink coffee.

We can also put them at the very beginning or end of the sentence. This makes them stronger:

- Often, I go to the cinema.
- I go to the cinema often.
