## WOULD AND COULD FOR MAKING REQUESTS

## Requests

We use **could you** ... and **would you** ... as polite ways of **telling or asking someone to do something**:

Could you take a message, please?

Would you carry this for me, please?

Can and will are less polite:

Can you take a message, please?

Will you carry this for me, please?

Offers and invitations

We use can I ... to make offers:

Can I help you?

Can I do that for you?

We can also use shall I ...:

Shall I help you with that?

Shall I call you on your mobile?

We sometimes say I can ... or I could ... or I'll (I will) ... to make an offer:

I can do that for you if you like.

I could give you a lift to the station.

I'll do that for you if you like.

I'll give you a lift to the station.

We use would you like (to) ... for invitations:

Would you like to come round *tomorrow?*Would you like *another drink?*
