

In different lessons, we studied comparatives. Comparatives are used to compare two people, places, or things. For example,

- Lions are more dangerous than puppies.
- Starbucks is better than Coffee Bean.
- She works harder than I do.
- Ben <u>eats more slowly</u> than his wife does.
- It was much more expensive than I thought.

There is one other way that we can compare two things.

We can use "as...as...." to show that 2 things are the same.

And, we can use "not as....as...." to show that 2 things are different.



## A NOTE TO REMEMBER:

We often compare two things with adjectives. Use this pattern to show that two things are the same.

## Subject 1 + be verb + as + adjective + as + Subject 2

- She is <u>as tall</u> as her brother.
- Pepsi is <u>as expensive as</u> Coke.
- McDonald's is <u>as delicious as</u> Burger King.
- Thailand is <u>as hot</u> as Vietnam.
- Apples are <u>as sweet</u> as pears.
- Dogs are <u>as cute as</u> cats.
