



First Conditional With Will

This type of conditional is used when a situation is real or possible. As a conditional it is formed with an “If clause” and a “main clause”.

The “**If clauses**” present possible conditions. The **main clause** expresses results. The “If clause” is in present tense even though it refers to a future event or situation.

**If clause + simple present.
Main clause + future tense. (will).**

First Conditional With Will

"If" clause

- If it rains tomorrow,
- If I need help,

Main clause


- I will take my umbrella.
- I will ask you.

Main clause

- I will take my umbrella
- I will ask you

"If" clause

- if it rains tomorrow.
- if I need help.



Remember:
If the "if" clause comes first, a comma is usually used. If the "if" clause comes second, there is no coma.

Remember: in simple present with the third person we add "s"
