UNIT II. PEOPLE

- People information.
 - Ask for and say people's nationalities.
 - Ask for and give phone numbers and e-mail addresses.
 - Identify family members and give their ages.
 - Give information about family and friends.
 - Ask and talk about people's personalities.
 - Say they something is true and not true.
 - Ask and talk about people's appearance.
 - Describe their personality and appearance.

UNIT III. WHAT'S THAT?

- Things.
 - Ask about and identify everyday items.
 - Ask what something is called in English.
 - Talk about clothes and possessions.
 - Describe favorite possessions.
- Weather and seasons.
- Opinions.
 - Ask for and give opinions.
 - Talk about what they would like to do.
 - Talk about a place they would like to visit.

UNIT IV: DAILY LIFE, FREE TIME, WORK TIME

- Daily life
 - Describe how people get around.
 - Ask and tell the time.
 - Ask and answer questions about routines.
- Free time & Work time
 - Describe the things they do on weekends.
 - Talk about their online habits.
 - Accept and decline help.
 - Ask and answer questions about leisure activities.
 - Discuss how they use technology.
 - Identify and talk about jobs.
 - Ask for someone on the phone.
 - Have someone wait.
 - Describe their talents and abilities.
 - Talk about study and work programs.

FINAL PROJECT

For the final project of this block, you are required to make a 3-minute audio about meeting a new friend using some of the language functions learned previously. Your performance needs to be a dialogue that includes the following:

- Past of verb to be.

- Adjective and vacation activities.
- Be going to and yes/no questions.
- Wh questions with be going to.
- Object pronouns.
- Months, dates and party checklist.

Write on a Word document your dialogue and rehearse it with your partner before you record yourselves. Remember you can ask your facilitator if you have doubts (grammar, lexis or pronunciation).

Record your voice and save it in a file you can upload in the platform. Be careful it must be compatible so that your facilitator can unload it.

You must send both archives:

- Audio file to the task/assignment section, and you must give it a name.
