INTRODUCTION TO THE UNIT

This unit helps you express more about yourself and the people you care about. With simple words and short sentences, you'll be able to say more, ask more, and understand others better. We'll practice together and use fun, real-life examples to make it easy for you to feel confident when speaking English.

Let's learn how to describe the world of people around us and share who we are, too.

UNIT OBJECTIVE

By the end of this unit, you will be able to:

- Ask someone about their nationality and say where you or others are from.
- Ask and share basic contact information like phone numbers and email addresses.
- Talk about your family and friends using full sentences and give details about their age or what they do.
- Describe what people look like (tall, short, hair, etcetera) and what they are like as a person (kind, funny, quiet, etcetera).
- Use short and clear sentences to say whether something is true or false about someone.
- Feel more comfortable using English to talk about real people in your life, including yourself!

This unit is about connection: describing, asking, sharing, and understanding people. You'll be practicing English for real conversations that happen every day, with real people. Let's begin!
