

TALK ABOUT A PLACE THEY WOULD LIKE TO VISIT

Many of us dream of visiting new places – cities, beaches, countries, or even magical places we’ve only seen in pictures. Talking about where you’d like to go helps you use your imagination and express your hopes and interests in English. It’s also a great way to connect with others, because everyone has a place they’d love to explore someday. In this section you will learn how to say which place you would like to visit, and why.

How to Talk About Places You Want to Visit

We use the phrase “I **would** like to visit...” to talk about places we want to go.

- I would like to visit New York.
- She would like to visit the beach.
- They’d like to visit Japan.

You can also say why you want to go:

- Because I love museums.
- Because it’s beautiful.
- Because I want to see the snow.
- Because I like the food.

This way, your sentence is more complete and more personal.

You can use “I’d like to...” or “We’d like to...” to sound more natural and friendly.

Real Life Example

Teacher: What’s one place you’d like to visit?

Luz: I’d like to visit Italy.

Teacher: Why?

Luz: Because I love Italian food and old cities.

Teacher: That sounds amazing!

Even with a few words, you can express your interest in the world and learn about others too.

Examples:

You Might Say:

- I'd like to visit the beach.
- I'd like to go to Canada.
- I want to visit the pyramids in Egypt.
- I'd like to see the snow in Alaska.
- I want to visit Disney World.

There's no wrong answer – your dream is your dream.
