

DESCRIBE THE THINGS THEY DO ON WEEKENDS

During the week, we usually have a schedule. But on the weekend or in our free time, we can choose what to do. Some people rest, others visit family, play games, go to the movies, or stay home. In this section, you'll learn how to describe your free time activities in English and ask others about theirs.

Describing your weekend helps you express your preferences and learn about others' cultures or habits. It's also a friendly way to start a conversation and practice useful verbs in the present tense.

Talking About the Weekend and Free Time

We use the same simple structure with present tense verbs:

- I go to the park.
- We play soccer.
- She listens to music.
- They visit their grandparents.

Weekend Activities



You can also use time expressions like:

- on Saturdays
- in the afternoon
- on the weekend
- after school

You can ask others:

- What do you do on the weekend?
- Do you play video games?
- Do you like going out?

Remember: when talking about he/she, the verb ends in -s:

- He plays basketball.
- She watches movies.

Real Life Example

Carlos: What do you do on Sundays?

Iris: I sleep late and go for a walk.

Carlos: That sounds relaxing. I usually visit my cousins.



Even short answers can say a lot about your personality and habits.
