

IDENTIFY AND TALK ABOUT JOBS

Talking about jobs helps you describe what people do. You can talk about your family, your friends, or your own future. Knowing how to say simple job names in English helps you share your world and understand others.

Talking about jobs is not just about saying a profession – it's also a way to show respect for what people do. It's useful when you're describing your family, asking questions about others, or thinking about what you want to be in the future.

How to Talk About Jobs

To ask:

- What do you do?
- What's your job?
- What does your dad do?

To answer:

- I'm a student.
- She is a teacher.
- He works in a hospital.
- My mom is a cook.

Common jobs:

- teacher, doctor, student, cook, driver, farmer, nurse, seller, mechanic, police officer.

You can also say where the person works:

- She works at a school.
- He works in a restaurant.

Real Life Example

You: What does your brother do?

Friend: He's a mechanic.

You: That's cool! My aunt is a nurse.
