

TALK ABOUT STUDY AND WORK PROGRAMS

Sometimes people are part of a program to study or learn a skill, like cooking, mechanics, computers, or languages. Talking about these programs helps you explain what you are doing or what you want to do in the future.

Study and work programs help us prepare for the future. Being able to talk about what you're learning or what you'd like to do one day helps you set goals and connect with people who share your interests. It also helps in interviews and applications.

How to Talk About Programs

You can say:

- I study in a computer program.
- He's in a music course.
- She is learning English.
- They are part of a job training program.

To ask:

- What are you studying?
- Are you in a course?
- What program are you in?

You can also express goals:

- I want to learn to cook.
- I hope to join a work program.

Use words like:

- study, learn, train, join, prepare, improve.

Real Life Example

You: Are you in any study program?

Friend: Yes, I'm learning English and computer basics.

You: That's great! I want to join a mechanics course.
