
What is a Collocation?

In grammar, a collocation is the <u>combination</u> <u>of certain</u> <u>verbs</u> with certain nouns or <u>other words</u>.

These combinations, or collocations, tend to vary from language to language, and may interfere with your conceptualization of these in English.

For example, in some countries like Mexico, the expression "make a decision" is translated/interpreted as tomar una decisión.



The verb "make" is normally understood as hacer, not as tomar: this means you do not have to translate, but <u>re-</u><u>conceptualize the ideas</u>!

Does the expression hacer una decisión draw an addecuate idea in <u>your native language thinking</u>? In English thinking it does!

In other words:

Correct: make a decision

Incorrect: take a decision

Other examples are:

Correct: take a picture

Incorrect: make a picture





Correct: do the homework

Incorrect: make the homework
