Remember!


Present Perfect is a tense we use to express that we have <u>experience</u> doing certain activities

- We add <u>already</u> in <u>affirmatives</u> to say the activity was completed before it was expected, or just to emphasize it.
- We add **yet** in negatives to emphasize that it has not been completed.

Check the way we structure them.

Affirmative:

Subject + have/has + already + (verb in PAST PARTICIPLE) + complement.




I have already traveled to other countries.

Remember!

Negative:

Subject + haven't/hasn't + (verb in PAST PARTICIPLE) + complement + yet.



I *haven't* had children *yet*.
