Remember that it is always important to practice your English beyond the course activities.

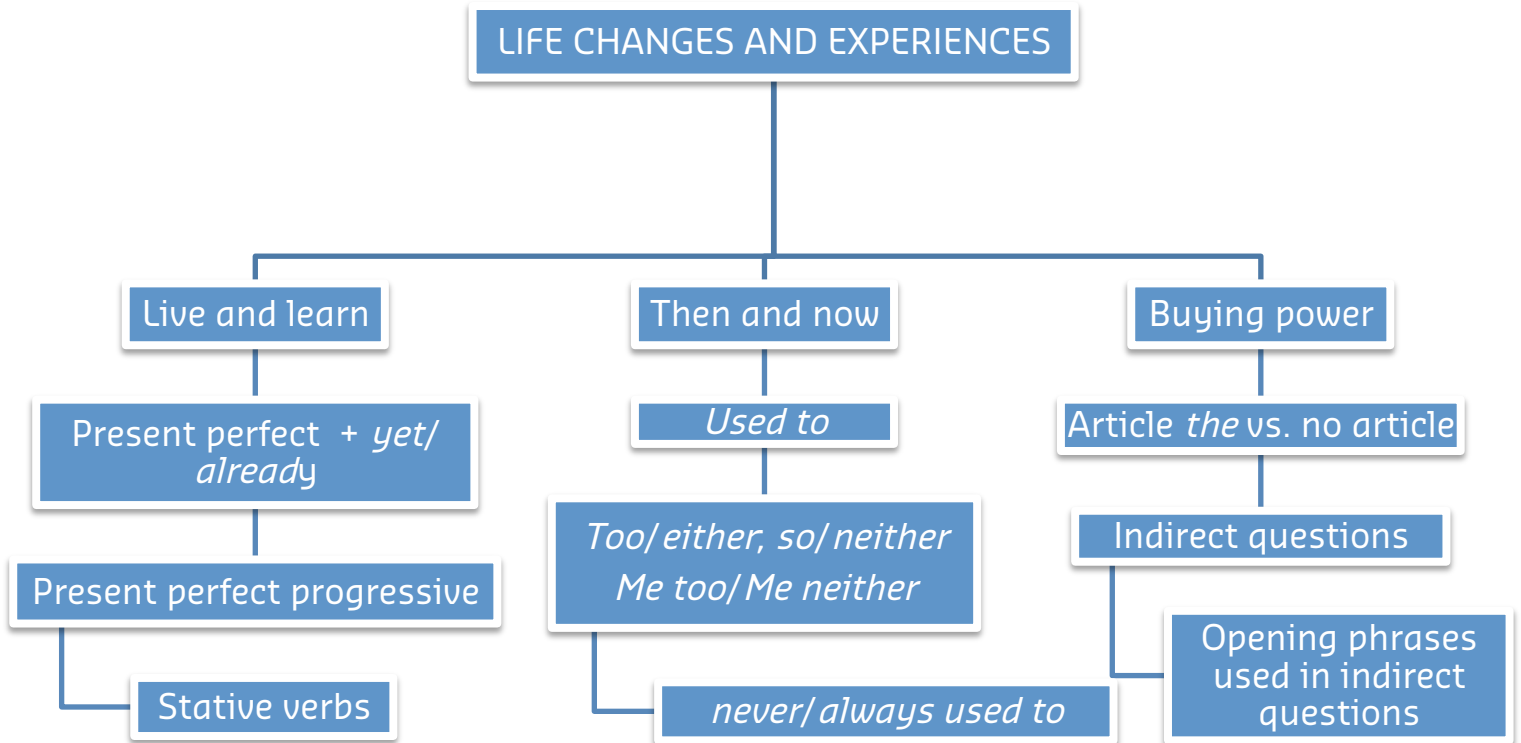
Try it even every little time you have the chance!
