INTRODUCTION


This unit opens to more varied and complex grammar used in a variety of situational contexts. You will first be introduced to the present perfect commonly used to synthesize past events as experiences which continue in the present. Naturally, this means that by the end of this unit you are expected to be able to differentiate between the use of simple past and present perfect. Furthermore, you will learn how to express advice and warning, and how to use phrasal verbs with direct and indirect objects.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE OF THE UNIT

The student will be able to understand and produce sentences which include the adverbs too, (not)...enough, really, and very; as well as statements with_phrases of preference (I would prefer, I'd rather), and ideas with will and going to, as well as with modals of possibility. The learner is able to give his/her personal opinions of topics where vocabulary related to food, love relationships, and nature is used through the practice of conversations in voice files and the writing about diverse conversations.
