DIFFERENT WAYS OF TALKING ABOUT THE FUTURE

USE
Use <i>may</i> , <i>might</i> , and <i>will</i> to make predictions about the future.
Use <i>going to</i> to make predictions about the future and talk about plans or intentions.
Use <i>present progressive</i> to talk about plans intentions.
Use <i>simple present</i> to talk about things that happen in the future at a specific time on a schedule.
