Use **used to** and the base form of a verb for habitual actions in the past that are not true now.

They	didn't use to

Examples for statements:

• My son **used to love** candy. But now he doesn't care for it.



• I didn't use to eat vegetables. But now I love them.



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Examples for questions and answers:

• **Didn't** Frank **used to avoid** sweets? ——— Yes, he did. / No, he didn't.



• What did you use to eat for lunch? ——— Chips a diet soda. But not anymore.

Examples:

- 1. I used to eat fatty foods.
- 2. Jack used to like dairy products.
- 3. Sally used to be a vegetarian.
- 4. I used to like seafood.
