FINAL PROJECT

For the final project, the student will have to choose from the following topics to make:

- A PowerPoint presentation WITH PICTURES ONLY!
- A 5-minute speech about the PPT (recorded).
- A Word document with the written speech.

All the information MUST be in your own words; otherwise you will get a zero.

Topics to choose from:

- Your favorite piece of art.
- Your favorite pet.
- The importance of play in our lives.
- Describe your professional or academic life.
- Technology in education.
- The importance of music in our lives
- The importance of Technology in Education.
- Ethics in our lives.

In the recorded speech, you will need to include and integrate grammatical structures and lexical expressions studied during the course, taking in consideration other elements such as the pronunciation, pace and originality as part of the evaluation.

The content of the speech must adapt one example (or more) of at least 10 of these grammar points. It is very important that you highlight the sentences where you include the grammar points:

- Count and Uncountable Nouns.
- Use of Articles
- Adverb Phrases.
- Object Complements.
- Reduced Adverb Clauses of Time.
- Future Passive.
- Conditional Conjunctions.
- Time Expressions "By the Time".

- Future Perfect.
- Future Perfect Progressive.
- Infinitive Clauses.
- Adverbial Phrases.
- Reflexive Pronouns.
- Mixed Conditionals.
- Word Order.
- Word Order with Reflexive Pronouns.
- Indefinite Pronouns.
- Intensifiers: So, such, too, enough.
- Indirect Speech.
- Verbs + ing.
- Comparative and superlative adjectives.
- Make a PPT presentation with pictures about the topic you will talk about (pictures of the work of art you chose, technology, music, etc.).
- Write your speech on a Word document and rehearse it before you record it. Remember, you can ask your facilitator if you have doubts (grammar, lexis or pronunciation). Include 10 grammar points learned in the course, highlight them.
- Record your voice and save it in a file you can upload to the Platform. Be careful with compatibility so that your facilitator can listen to it.
